




# Holy Week Retreat 27 - 31 March 2024

## Packages

#### Non-residential

### £300 per person

This includes our full programme of services and worship, and special activities with our clergy, as well as a light lunch and three-course dinner each evening, at our onsite Cathedral Lodge hotel.

Accommodation and breakfast not included.

### Residential

### £950 per person\*

This includes our full programme of services and worship, and special activities with our clergy, as well as 4-nights full-board accommodation at our onsite Cathedral Lodge hotel, with full Kentish breakfast, light lunch, and three-course dinner.

\*This price is based on single occupancy. Our double occupancy residential package is £1,350. Both double and twin rooms are available.
